

WHAT IS THE GAUTENG REBUILDING FUND?

The Gauteng Rebuilding Fund is the Gauteng Provincial Government's response to the recent unprecedented challenges faced by small businesses. The R100m fund includes a R50m contribution by the Gauteng Provincial Government and a further R50m from the Industrial Development Corporation (IDC).

HOW CAN FORMAL SMMES BENEFIT FROM THE FUND?

This fund has been exclusively set aside to support businesses that have suffered losses due to COVID-19 and looting that took place in July.

The loan/grant blend will be capped at R1 million for SMMEs affected by COVID-19 or unrests

The fund will help businesses cover rebuilding costs, repairs, replacement of infrastructure, inventory.

equipment and critical supplies. It will also cover increased business security and employee costs.

WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE INFORMAL TRADERS WHO WISH TO APPLY?

- The business must operate in Gauteng and have its head office in Gauteng
- The business must be 100% South African owned
- The business must have been registered with the CIPC by at least 28 February 2020
- Bank statements must be submitted to prove that the business has been operating
- The trading history of the entity should be more than a year
- The business must be registered and compliant with CIPC and SARS
- The application must be accompanied by:
 - » Certified ID Copies of Directors/members

- » Business Profile
- » 3 Months Bank Statements and management accounts
- » FICA documents (e.g. Municipal accounts, letter from traditional authority)
- » 6 Months Cashflow Projections – where applicable
- » Management Accounts after investment if applicable (assistance available)
- We will ask you to provide proof that your business was affected by COVID 19 or unrests
- The proof may be in the form of statements that show a loss or decrease in income, evidence of damaged business assets, a case number to show that a case was opened, or any other possible evidence that may be specific to your business.
- You must confirm that you have not received other funding assistance from other Development Funding Institutions (such as the IDC and SEFA) as part of their COVID/Civil unrest assistance Programs.

INFORMATION FOR FORMALLY REGISTERED SMMES

- You should not be a previous recipient of the business development support from GEP or other DFIs during the 2020/2021 financial year.
- You must confirm that you have submitted an insurance claim from SASRIA or any other insurance provider
- If you are applying for COVID-19 support, you should not have previously received UIF or TERS support
- If you have previously received TERS and UIF support, and your business suffered losses because of the unrest, you may apply for funding but only for losses related to the riot.
